Background:

Three Waters Wind Farm, LLC (Three Waters) is proposing to construct a 200-megawatt (MW) Large Wind Energy Conversion System in Jackson County. On February 12, 2019, Three Waters filed a <u>Petition for Exemption</u> from certain Certificate of Need application requirements pursuant to Minn. Rule 7849.0200, Subp. 6. Three Waters asserts that the information requirements for which it is requesting exemption are not applicable to independent power producers.

Filing Requirements: Utilities, telecommunications carriers, official parties, and state agencies are **required** to file documents using the Commission's electronic filing system (eFiling).
