Issue: Should the Commission grant Minnesota Power's request to extend the term of its EITE Rider until final rates are established in Minnesota Power's 2020 general rate case, in Docket No. E-015/GR-19-442?

Background: On October 7, 2019, Minnesota Power petitioned the Commission to extend the term of Minnesota Power's Energy-Intensive Trade-Exposed (EITE) Rider until final rates are established in Minnesota Power's 2020 general rate case. The Commission expects Minnesota Power to submit its rate case petition on November 1, 2019. The EITE Rider was approved for a four-year term by the Commission in this docket on December 21, 2016. The Rider took effect on February 1, 2017.
